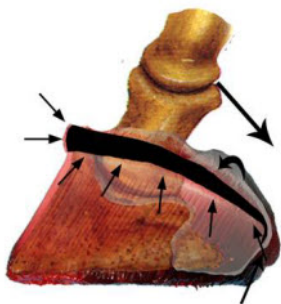

THREE DAY CURRICULUM:

DAY ONE:

Morning – Interactive classroom on the science of Applied Equine Podiatry, Functional Anatomy of the Equine Foot, Hoof Wall Growth Theory, Hemodynamic Function and The Suspension Theory of Hoof Dynamics™.

Afternoon – Continued study of energy utilization and management in the foot, the HPT Method for obtaining true dimensional and neurological balance, the Spectrum of Usability™ for evaluating the hoof condition and limits of use for the horse at any given time, and critical steps to rehabilitating and maintaining your horse's feet.

DAY TWO:

Morning – Functional anatomy of the Equine Distal Limb explained and demonstrated through Instructor dissection of a cadaver foot.

Afternoon – Preparation of cadaver feet for trimming; interactive student evaluation of cadaver feet using the Spectrum of Usability; tool distribution; tool safety and correct tool use.

DAY THREE:

Morning – Step-by-step explanation and demonstration of correct tool use. Begin interactive student practice with cadaver feet.

Afternoon – Student application of the HPT Method to cadaver feet, with discussion of environmental influences on the equine foot.

Course Credit toward DAEP Diploma – The hours from up to two Three-Day Courses can be applied toward a Diploma from the Institute as a Degreed Applied Equine Podiatrist for students who enroll in the Diploma program within 45 days after taking their first 3 Day Course.
